# Garbage Collection

## COLLECTION TIMES

Collection times may vary. **Please have your garbage and blue bags out by 7 a.m.** on your collection day. Pick up is between 7 a.m. and 10 p.m. If there is construction in your back lane, place garbage and blue bags at your front street.

## SIZE OF CONTAINERS

Cans must hold **no more than 100 litres**, have fixed handles and easily removable lids. **Filled cans must weigh less than 20 kg (44 lbs).**

## LOCATION OF CONTAINERS

Please place your garbage and blue bags as close as possible to the curb or edge of the road or alley. **Keep it away from parked cars.**

## ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

Most waste materials generated by the average home are collected. These include food scraps, packaging, yard and garden waste, smaller household items, floor sweepings, etc. Ashes, soiled diapers, kitty litter, pet feces, sawdust and vacuum dust **must be double bagged**. Tree branches must be under 4 ft. long and securely tied in small bundles not weighing more than 20 kg (44 lbs).

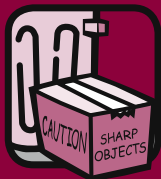
## UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

These include manure, tree stumps, roots, turf, large furniture, mattresses, major household appliances, large metal auto parts and construction and renovation material. **Call 311 for proper disposal.**

# Winter Collection

It's important to make sure your garbage and blue bags (and Christmas tree) are accessible and visible in the winter. **Snow and ice should be cleared so that the collector can collect your waste and recyclables safely.** Do not place collection materials on windrows or snow banks. Please place on level ground as close as possible to the road/alley.

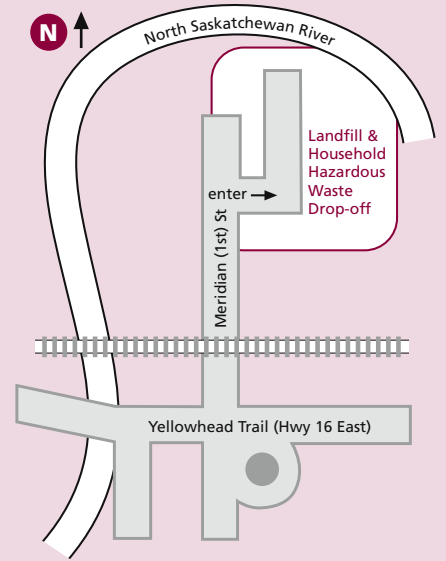

# Blue Bag Collection

Blue bag recycling is easy. **No sorting. No spilling. Just rinse, flatten and bag it.**

## ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Cardboard/boxboard (stack & bundle)
- Newspapers and magazines
- Paper
- Milk cartons and jugs
- Metal cans (keep lids inside of cans)
- Aluminum food containers
- Empty aerosol cans
- Glass jars/bottles (green, brown & clear)
- Plastic containers/bags

## PLEASE NOTE

- Discard all liners from boxboard.
- Foam plastics (egg cartons, meat trays) are NOT recyclable.
- Shredded paper goes in the garbage, not blue bag.

## ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

(please sort as listed below):

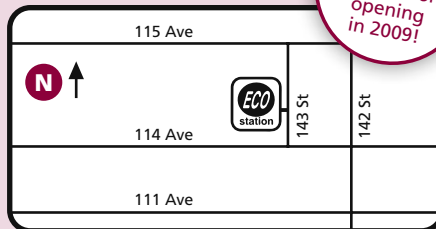
- Mixed recyclables - plastic bags and rinsed containers, milk cartons and jugs, juice boxes, glass jars and bottles (green, brown and clear glass ONLY), metal cans, aluminum food containers and phone books
- Magazines and newspapers
- Cardboard and boxboard
- Low grade paper

Thanks to your composting and recycling efforts, **60% of Edmonton's household waste is being diverted from the landfill!**

# Eco Stations

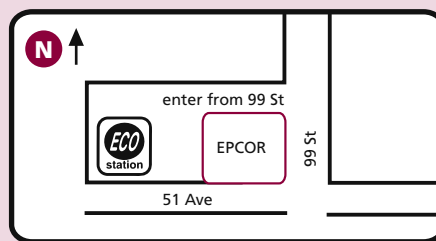
Eco Stations are drop-off centres for household hazardous waste, electronics and large bulky items. Pick-up service not available.
